23. Prove that $17 - 3\sqrt{3} \sim 83 + 47\sqrt{3}$ in $\mathbb{Z} + \mathbb{Z}\sqrt{3}$.

Solution. We have

$$\frac{83+47\sqrt{3}}{17-3\sqrt{3}} = \frac{(83+47\sqrt{3})(17+3\sqrt{3})}{(17-3\sqrt{3})(17+3\sqrt{3})} = \frac{1834+1048\sqrt{3}}{262} = 7+4\sqrt{3}.$$

 As

$$7^2 - 3 \cdot 4^2 = 49 - 48 = 1,$$

we see by Question 17 that

$$7 + 4\sqrt{3} \in U(\mathbb{Z} + \mathbb{Z}\sqrt{3}).$$

Hence

$$83 + 47\sqrt{3} \sim 17 - 3\sqrt{3}.$$
